The Honorable Dick Thornburgh served as Governor of Pennsylvania, Attorney General of the United States, and Under-Secretary-General of the United Nations during a public career that spanned over 25 years. Mr. Thornburgh is currently counsel to the international law firm K&L Gates LLP in its Washington, D.C. office and is Chairman of the Washington Legal Foundation's Legal Policy Advisory Board.

Eric Grannon is a partner in the white collar group in the Washington, D.C. office of White & Case LLP. He previously served as Counsel to the Assistant Attorney General in charge of the Antitrust Division of the Department of Justice, where he formulated U.S. antitrust enforcement policy and managed antitrust investigations. Before joining the Department of Justice, he tried 20 bench and jury trials as Special Assistant U.S. Attorney in the District of Columbia. Mr. Grannon's practice primarily focuses on antitrust matters, and he regularly stands before U.S. antitrust agencies. The *Global Competition Review* listed Mr. Grannon as one of the top "25 competition experts from 10 jurisdictions" to have passed through the "revolving door" between competition enforcement and private practice.
