

## **Speakers' Biographies**

**The Honorable Dick Thornburgh** has served as Governor of Pennsylvania, Attorney General of the United States, and Under-Secretary-General of the United Nations during a public career which spanned over 25 years. He is currently counsel to the international law firm K&L Gates LLP in its Washington, D.C. office. He is the Chairman of Washington Legal Foundation's Legal Policy Advisory Board.

**Jamie Gorelick** is a partner at WilmerHale in the firm's Regulatory and Government Affairs and Litigation/Controversy Departments, co-chair of the Defense, National Security and Government Contracts Practice Group, chair of the Public Policy and Strategy Practice Group, a member of the Government and Regulatory Litigation Practice Group, and a member of the Executive Committee. Ms. Gorelick was one of the longest serving Deputy Attorneys General of the United States, the second highest position in the Department of Justice. She was a member of the bipartisan National Commission on Terrorist Attacks Upon the United States (the "9/11 Commission") and Vice Chair of Fannie Mae from 1997-2003.

**Michael R. Bromwich** is a litigation partner resident in the Washington, D.C. and New York offices of Fried, Frank, Harris, Shriver & Jacobson LLP. He heads the Internal Investigations, Compliance and Monitoring practice group. He joined the firm as a partner in 1999. From 1994 to 1999, Mr. Bromwich served as Inspector General for the US Department of Justice. Before his appointment as Inspector General, Mr. Bromwich served as a federal prosecutor. From 1987 through 1989, he served as Associate Counsel in the Office of Independent Counsel for Iran-Contra.

**Michael E. Horowitz** is a litigation partner and member of the Business Fraud and Complex Litigation Group at the law firm Cadwalader, Wickersham & Taft LLP. He was nominated by President Bush and unanimously confirmed by the Senate in May 2003 to serve a six-year term as a Commissioner on the U.S. Sentencing Commission. Prior to joining Cadwalader, Mr. Horowitz served from 1999 to 2002 in the Justice Department's Criminal Division, first as Deputy Assistant Attorney General and then as Chief of Staff. During his tenure at Main Justice, Mr. Horowitz helped draft the Department's Principles of Corporate Prosecution.
