Former Chief Legal Officer and Federal Agency Chair Joins WLF's Legal Policy Advisory Board

WASHINGTON, DC— Washington Legal Foundation (WLF) and the Chair of its Legal Policy Advisory Board, Jay B. Stephens, are pleased to announce that **Roger Nober**, Director of the George Washington University Regulatory Studies Center, has joined WLF's advisory board.

Roger joined as Director of the Center, and as Professor of Practice of Public Policy and Public Administration in GW's Trachtenberg School, in January 2024. The Center's mission is to improve regulatory policy through research, education and outreach.
